# 2023 Roseburn Park Survey Results- a Vision for the Future

### Background

The consultation on future improvements for the park was available on paper and online at <a href="https://www.tinyurl.com/roseburnparksurvey">www.tinyurl.com/roseburnparksurvey</a> from 9th June 2023; it closed on 13<sup>th</sup> August 2023.

In hard copy 3,000 fliers were distributed door-to-door in the local area, and in schoolbags home for children at Roseburn Primary School. It was promoted electronically through Friends of Roseburn Park's Facebook page and website. The survey was also promoted through a mailshot to FoRP's 287 members- and to the 500 people who attended the café conversion launch event on 3<sup>rd</sup> July. The school used completion of the survey as a classroom activity for P6 and P7 pupils (28 were completed online and 21 were paper forms).

Both online and hard copy versions were accompanied by this plan of the park, marking possible locations for the 17 ideas in the survey.



## Make up of respondents

There were 238 respondents (a good increase from our 2016 survey that drew 141 replies), broken down as follows:

I am an adult	189	79%
I am under 18	49	21%

43 of the responses were on paper (18%); the remaining 82% were submitted online through a Google Form.

The percentage responses identifying with various kinds of park user were as follows: (note that each category was not exclusive- many pedestrians also cycled, walked the dog, etc)

#### Rating of main ideas

Respondents were asked to rate each idea with one of the following: Love It, Like It, Don't Mind It, Have Doubts, Dislike It. The table below combines Love It, Like It and Don't mind it replies. It is in descending order of popularity.
